4. It cost \$1.50 to clean a watch in 1904 – found on the sign at Black’s Jewelry store.
5. The Thorpe house was built with milled lumber.
6. The “Gamewell” was a fire alarm – located in the field across from the Wainwright Hotel.
7. The proprietor is Mr. Forester – found on the sign above the exterior stairs going to the Hotel.
8. Teachers earned around \$700.00 per year – found on the sign at Weedon School.
9. In 1909, 40,000,000 feet of lumber was brought to Calgary – found on the sign at Atlas lumber.
10. Symbols are the compass and square – found on the south door of the Traders Bank of Munson
11. It is the Barons Snooker Parlour – implied by the riddle.
12. The house is the Burnside Ranch House – found on the sign at the house.
13. The sod shack – implied by the riddle.
14. The 2 Storey Outhouse – behind the Wainwright Hotel – found on the sign.
15. Peter is his first name – found on the sign and implied by the riddle.
16. Canadian Pacific Railway – to bring settlers out West
17. Ireland – Trapper, Fur Trader, guide of the Mounted Police and a farmer.
18. \$1.50 to \$2.00 per day.
19. Frank Emerson Livingston built this story in Dundurn, Saskatchewan.
